Renew Your Mind

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God — what is good and acceptable and perfect.

~ Romans 12:2



Coming into a new year many of us find ourselves desiring to make resolutions to change something in our lives. Have you ever wanted to change something in your life, but no matter how hard you tried you kept following the same old patterns? In Romans 12: 2, the Apostle Paul gives us a clear idea as to how we can get out of the ruts and old ways we tend to think – renew our minds! Paul doesn't say to "try really hard" or "work at it", or even "pray about it" (although that may be the first step), he says we have to totally change the way we think.

How does this happen? How does one renew the mind? First, know it is an action of the Holy Spirit, a gift of grace. The mind of Christ is given to us as we exchange our will for God's. Second, we continually grow in our understandings, so that we might know Christ's mind. To renew our minds, then, we need a regular intake of God's Word.

The best churches are places where mind-renewal happens. They are places where we can take our daily struggles, share them with fellow strugglers, and together lift up the Scriptures to clarify our thinking and grow together into change. They are places where the things we are learning on Sunday are meditated upon during the week and are allowed to permeate into our lives, changing us.

So as you make your resolutions for 2017, consider renewing your mind. Consider making a habit of reading and meditating on the Scriptures, and attending worship each week. You just might change those old patterns!

Sometimes it is easy to think the grass might be greener elsewhere, but believe us, there are not many churches that can measure up to the standard that FUMC-G has set.



An Update from Our Building Committee

On December 14 the plans for our new building were looked at by the staff of the Gilbert Planning Commission. They made minor suggestions that are being incorporated into our design. We anticipate getting the revised plans before a study session of the Planning Commission in February and on the agenda for consideration for the whole Commission on March 1. Meanwhile the architectural firm, DFDG, will begin work on the construction documents, in concert with our Construction Manager at Risk, Concord. We expect to have a guaranteed maximum price from Concord by about the third week of March, at which time we can pursue a financing package to bring before the church. If all falls according to plan, an all

church conference will be held the last week of March to approve final design and the financing package for construction. Many things can happen that might alter this schedule, but this is our hoped for plan at this moment.



We hope to move our office into temporary locations the Monday after Easter so that demolition / construction can begin the following Monday. We anticipate 7 – 8 months of construction.

Make a Miracle Happen

A transplant can save a life! Mom is a 42

year old, single parent of 3. Until recently, Mom was in college full time to follow her passion of social work but had to take a medical leave until she gets her health back. She has hereditary polycystic kidney disease resulting in her current condition: end stage renal failure. She is a strong woman...in a very difficult situation. The solution is a kidney transplant.

To live she needs a kidney. Her team of doctors at Mayo have told her she qualifies immediately for the transplant. A live donor is best. Otherwise, she may wait on the transplant list for 3 to 7 years for one.

Anyone with 2 healthy kidneys can donate. Mayo in Phoenix can determine if there is a match. If the kidney donor is not compatible, Mayo might be able to match donors through a paired kidney exchange. All expenses for the donor to qualify-as well as have the surgery and recovery-will be covered or managed by her insurance.

Congregational Care to Expand Ministry

In January we will begin a training for Congregational Care Ministers at First Gilbert. Congregational Care Ministers (CCMs) are lay ministers who work alongside of the pastors to provide care for the church family, enabling us to provide a deeper level of care. They are trained to do a broad range of tasks depending on interest and gifts, including hospital visits, nursing home ministry, homebound communion, funeral care, food tidings, writing notes of hope, leading support groups, or doing fun things to offer care and love to those who are hurting in the congregation. Quite frankly, the opportunities are only limited by the imaginations of the ministers. And yet, we work in an organized and intentional way.

Congregational Care ministers differ from Stephen Ministers. Stephen Ministers are trained to do primarily one-to-one ministry. They are the "after" people. Stephen Ministers are a needed aspect of our Congregational Care here at First Gilbert. But the majority of the day-to-day care will be done by CCMs, who are the "before and during" people.

CCMs also differ from our Health and Wellness Team. This team consists of mostly health professionals who lead us in blood pressure Sundays and blood drives, keep us healthy with wellness events, keep the environmental health of our campus, and maintain our medical lending closet. They are also a vital team to our Congregational care.

We will be offering training beginning on Wednesday, January 11 from 6:30-8:30 for 9 weeks. If you are interested and have reviewed the requirements, you can find an application form on the website at www.firstgilbert.church. The cost for class materials is \$15.00. Training will be offered again in the future. There is also the opportunity to attend the training in April in Kansas City.

Because CCMs work along with the Pastors, there are Biblical and theological requirements, church membership requirements, and Safe Sanctuary training requirements, in addition to the CCM Training. A list of these requirements are also available on the website.

Congregational Care Ministers will be expected to commit to at least three hours per week to this ministry and attend a monthly Continuing Education and Information session.

Finance

Lord, What Do You Want to do Through Me?

It is often said that great tragedies build great strength. I saw my mother suffer a tragedy when my sister was killed during a violent crime. I couldn't believe something like that could happen to our family. I prayed I would never know they pain my mother was enduring. A short three years later my fear became true. In April of 2015 I lost my 23 yr. old son Nicholas to a heroin overdose. It was the worst thing I've experienced. I felt an indescribable pain as a piece of me died. My heart was in need of healing and mending and by the grace of God, my family, my close friends, my neighbors and my church family I was able to feel whole again. God used Facebook to lead me to a wonderful ministry called Hurting Moms, Mending Hearts out of California. I communicated with the publisher Sherry Ward and the author of the workbook, Cathy Brown, via emails and phone calls and after reading



the material I knew I was not alone, I felt hope and peace again. I started thinking "what can God do through me at this church" to bring hope, peace and healing to other hurting moms? Four months after losing my Nick, I started leading my first Hurting Moms group on Wednesday nights. It was an amazing experience for me as I was receiving my healing along with 9 other moms from our community and our church family. A few months later I started a second group and a third was just completed in November 2016. I have received a number of emails and calls letting me know how God's work through this ministry have brought much peace, hope, and even joy! Praise God!

I'm excited to host a Meet and Greet with the author of Hurting Moms, Mending Hearts, Cathy Taylor here at our church library (room 142) on Sunday, January 15th at 12:30 pm. Light refreshments and great fellowship for all Moms wishing to attend. Cathy will be taping my testimony for a live Facebook video and she also wants to have a group photo from this event to add to her website. Please come and bring your books for signing. Invite other moms from the community who may also benefit from this time of encouragement. May God continue to use each one of us to lead all people to the Peace and Love of Christ. ~ Sharon Kotsonas
