I'm sure I am missing some. Each is a unique offering for a particular group of folks at a particular spot in the journey of faith. Check your bulletin and the rest of this newsletter for further information.

Which one is for you? I know one has your name written all over it! I hope you will pick one that intrigues you, that calls to you, that challenges you. Then commit yourself to regular attendance, and be here to grow with us into all that God calls us to do and be.

Why does our church provide mission opportunities for its members? Have you ever considered the answer to that question? We have mission opportunities available all through the year. There is always something going on, whether it is the monthly meal at UMOM, gathering groceries for Gilbert Open Arms food pantry, staying the night at the church with homeless families, or going on a mission trip. As a church we are the hands and feet of Jesus in many ways. Yet, we are much more than that. We are a blessing to Jesus himself.

Doing acts of kindness and mercy with others in mission is a way we worship God. It is a way we honor Jesus with our lives. We do mission work as a church because in loving others we are loving Jesus himself. We serve because by our service toward others, we are doing it for God.

Our church gives you many opportunities to be involved. As I write this, we have homeless families living at night for a week at our church through Family Promise. Many of you are bringing in meals, playing with children, helping them with homework, keeping parents company in the evenings, and providing a safe place for them to sleep in our classrooms, away from shelters and the streets.

On the last Sunday of each month someone hands out bags for you to bring back the next week. Items of greatest need are listed on the bag. These bags help the families in need of food in the Gilbert area.

The second Saturdays each month people gather in the activity center at 2:00 and make a meal that is taken to UMOM's Watkins Shelter in Phoenix. Others come later in the afternoon to go as a group to serve the meal.

We blessed 310 school backpacks last Sunday and this week people are delivering them to schools and agencies in the area for children in need as they begin the new year. Coming up you will hear about the UMOM Walk for the Homeless and a chance to paint a house for someone who couldn't paint it for themselves through our Paint-a-Thon event. And there is more to come as we get closer to the holidays!



Orchard Africa Missions Trip 2017

It is with a humble heart that this team returns to our church family to share this journey. A journey that is hard to put into words.

The basic summary of our trip is simple. We taught vertical agriculture to 25 adults in the morning and taught "Prayer" Vacation Bible School to 23 children in the afternoon. The trip also included an overview of South African history, HIV training, a trip to a local cemetery and home visits in the village of Dihatshwane. We met local pastors working for Orchard: Africa and went to church in Top Village. We also visited the community garden of Top Village. The simple comes in what we did.

It is harder to put into words what we felt. We were welcomed, open arms adorned with happy faces. Smiles, songs and the love of Christ were everywhere we went. As we taught the two curriculums, adults and children were focused on the lessons, engaged in the opportunity to learn and present in the joy of the moment. God is evident. As a mission team, we each had our own concerns going in but once in, once you gave in and leaned into Christ the words came to share, pray and teach. When words didn't come, a hug always sufficed.

"Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me – watch how I do it. *Learn the unforced rhythms of grace*. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly." Matthew 11:28-30 MSG

The people of South Africa showed us the unforced rhythms of grace. A rhythm each of us are willing to share and to incorporate into life at home. Look for us (request us) to come and share our stories in your small groups. The mission trip reiterates to us in a bold and vibrant way that He is the creator of everything.



Look What Your Giving is Helping Us Do!

Thank you for your faithful and generous support of our church. During the month of July, your donations to the church's General Fund:

- Provided for our Director of Youth and Family Ministries, Ray Vallera, to plan 3 Youth Mission Trips to San Francisco (in June), Cortez, CO, and Washington, DC. A total of 19 youth and 5 adult chaperones went on the trips, where they served on various projects at each site.
- Made possible the church's monthly payment of our annual apportionments to our Desert Southwest Conference. Apportionments help support the Conference budget, including national and global missions, new faith communities, urban ministries programs including UMOM, Wesley Community Center, and Justa Center, camping ministries at Mingus Mountain and Potosi Pines, and campus ministries at U of A, ASU and NAU.
- Provided facilities to host four Family Promise families, including 13 children, who stayed at our church July 23-30. Many volunteers from our church helped set up and take down sleeping rooms, provided evening meals and activities, and stayed overnight to provide assistance if needed during the night. Often one or more families "graduate" to their own apartments during the week they are at our church, with new families coming in to take their place. It's exciting to play a small part in the success of the Family Promise program.

Without your gifts, we could not do this work which is all focused on our Mission "To Lead People of All Ages on the Journey to Become Deeply Devoted Followers of Jesus"!

Adult Wednesday Night Classes Begin August 9th:

Alpha – (Mike Miller, teacher)

Alpha begins with a Celebration Dinner on August 2nd at 6:30pm. The ten week class follows starting on August 9th. This class is an excellent refresher course for longtime Christians, and a chance for exploring Christians to ask questions about the faith. It gives you everything you need to know that is foundational to our faith.

Journey 101 - (Rev. Gwen Mader, teacher)

While Alpha is about the faith, Journey 101 is a series of three 6 week classes that give the essentials to live out the Christian faith. It is designed to help us grow as Christians.

Knowing God (Aug 9 - Sept 13) - Discover tools to deepen your

understanding of God and the Scriptures.

Loving God (Sept 20 – Oct 25) – Experience spiritual practices that

will help you to love God and others.

Serving God (Nov 1 - Dec 13) - Learn how you can serve others and

share Christ.

Your Move and Breathing Room - (Vicki Hanson, teacher)

These two Andy Stanley courses, each 4 weeks, will resonate particularly with young families. What do we do when it's your move and you aren't sure what to do? How do we make decisions we never anticipated having to make? How do you find breathing room in an already crowded schedule, especially when breathing room feels more like a luxury?

Disciple I Bible Study - (Sylvia Harris & Mollie Hahn, co-teachers) 24 weeks

Disciple I presents an overview of the entire Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Participants will read portions of the Bible and the Guidebook as homework each day and come to the study to discuss it. This study is a valuable resource to a general knowledge of the Bible.

Experiencing God - (Rev. Deborah Lerner, teacher)

Experiencing God is a thirteen week class that awakens us to a radically God-centered way of life in which we know and do the will of God. You will learn how to know when God is speaking to you, recognize God's activity around you, adjust your life to God's ways, identify what God wants to do through you, and respond to God's activity in your life.
