Message from Pastor Deborah

November is one of my favorite months of the year. We can count on cooler days and nights, which refresh the spirit and body. We're not yet into the whirlwind of activities and preparation for Christmas. In contrast to other times of the year, in this one month we are encouraged even by our culture to be grateful and give thanks.



What is it that fills your heart with joy? Where are you experiencing the goodness and grace and love of God in your life, and that of your family? In our worship services we have already begun to invite you to think of the ways this church has blessed your life. Sunday November 5 we will celebrate All Saints Day, honoring those who have graduated to glory in the last year. It is a fitting Sunday to ask you to give thanks for those persons whose life and faith have touched your life and faith. Who has shaped your journey toward Christ?

Every Sunday when we gather we give thanks for the greatest blessing of all, remembering John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he GAVE his only son, so that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life," and Ephesians 5:25b-26 "Christ loved the church, and gave himself up for her."

When we gather it is always in gratitude for the gift of abundant life, also translated "eternal" life, that is ours in Christ Jesus. Everything we have, and everything we are, comes from God.

This month we are inviting you to consider how much God has given to you, and to respond in gratitude and love. On November 19 we will give you an opportunity to express your love and gratitude in a tangible way, by offering to God and to this church an estimate of your giving for 2018. This is a practical matter, in that it enables your finance team to set a budget for the coming year. Much more deeply, it is a spiritual matter. Along the way we hope you will use the free devotional guide, "Practicing Extravagant Generosity," which has been available in the church lobby for the last two weeks.

The materials we are using to guide our messages poses this question: "If God owns it all, why should I give?" The answer it suggests? "Because giving...expresses your **love for God**; is a sign of your **gratitude** to God; makes you a **partner with God**; **honors God** as your provider; results in your **spiritual growth**; **changes** your heart and **pleases God**.

I think they have it right! I hope you will join us each week as we continue our reflections on gratitude, giving, and Extravagant Generosity, which flows from a grateful and loving heart.

A Word from Pastor Gwen:

"The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." - John 3:8

Lately, I have been thinking about the illogical nature of God. About how illogical it is that God our King would choose to become a baby, born into a poor family, empty of power, taking the form of a slave. About how illogical it is that God would chose to die the death of a criminal to save an undeserving and unresponsive humanity, to pour out His grace on people, even people like me. How illogical it is that God's plan to transform the world was by sending the Spirit into the hearts of everyday, imperfect people, and having us die to ourselves in order to live. It all sounds so . . . illogical!

But isn't that just the way God usually works? God acts outside the confines of human experience and wisdom, doing the greatest acts in the strangest ways. God seems to be very good at turning things upside down to make them right side up.

So when we pray, God does what he usually does, answering our prayers in ways that surprise us! God answers in ways far exceeding anything we could ever ask or think. And I love that about God! I love the way God surprises us! I love the unpredictable nature of the Holy Spirit. I love that I can loosen my grip on defining the future and trust that God will do His creative work.

In his book <u>Draw the Circle</u>, Mark Batterson writes, "I'm still in awe of the strange and mysterious ways in which God works, but I have come to expect the unexpected because God is predictably unpredictable. The only thing I can predict with absolute certainty is this: the more you pray, the more you will experience holy surprises."

Would you pray with me that God would surprise us in illogical ways as we move into the Holiday seasons of Thanksgiving and Christmas? Would you pray with me that God would work in strange ways to do great things in and through our church? Let's pray that we would experience God's holy surprises each day. What do you say?


