A Message from Pastor Deborah "Lord, what do You want to do through me?"

May is a time of transition: of graduation to new levels and moving toward the (hopefully!) more relaxed pace of summer; of celebrating accomplishments and feeling a sadness about leaving old friends behind for new places of study, or first jobs, or even summer breaks. We will recognize the transition of our confirmand class into full membership in the church, and print the names of those graduating at any level, on Sunday May 15. On Sunday May 22 children and youth of First UMC will move up to the next grade level in First Kidz and



youth Sunday School. There will be tears among our youngers to leave behind beloved teachers, soon to be replaced (we hope!) by eagerness to return to the "new" group; and eager anticipation but maybe also a little fear for our 6th graders moving into youth group. It is all part of life, as we grow and are transformed into all God would have us be.

Our church is also in a time of transition as we move forward into the fullness of our Building on the Past / Believing in the Future building project. On Sunday April 24 the church gathered and authorized our Building Committee to contract for detailed design and construction documents based on the preliminary concept designs presented in the detail brochure and renderings. We set a budget of \$2.4 million to move forward on the list of projects provided in the detail brochure, based on the idea that we should borrow no more than 2 times the amount pledged to the capital campaign. We authorized our finance team to begin looking at loan packages, not to exceed \$2 million, to present to a later congregational meeting, along with the final plans.

We hope to be ready to come back to the congregation in late fall for approval of both a financing package and detail design. If we are able to get that done, we may begin construction as early as January 2017, and hope to complete it by Fall 2017. Meanwhile First Fruit and earlier contributions to the Building on the Past / Believing in the Future campaign have already reached \$142,470.10. Thank you all for your generous gifts! These "up front" gifts are especially valuable as they give us leverage to move ahead.

There will be some interesting times ahead, as we figure out the logistics of having our campus under construction. It will be both a challenge and an opportunity to explore new ways of doing things that may have become quite routine.

Please be in prayer: for our graduates, for our confirmands, for those in transitions in life, and for our beloved church, as we move through a major transition in our life together. Pray especially for our building committee, as they continue their work.

One Love By Rev. David J. Harriss

ONE LOVE, ONE BLOOD, ONE LIFE, YOU GOT TO DO WHAT YOU SHOULD, ONE LIFE WITH EACH OTHER, SISTERS, BROTHERS, ONE LIFE BUT WE'RE NOT THE SAME, WE GET TO CARRY EACH OTHER, CARRY EACH OTHER, ONE...LIFE, ONE.



From the CD *Achtung Baby*, these are the closing lyrics from U-2's former number one hit *One*. It is quite the difficult task to achieve a feeling of *oneness* with another person in this world today, isn't it? We have so many lifestyle options, so many differing vocations, so many different social, economic, and political opinions, and so many different religious beliefs. Yet, Jesus took upon this difficult task of praying in the Garden of Gethsemene, that all of humanity might strive to be *one* just as he and The Father were *one*. That somehow, we would all be a part of the fullness of God as we strive to have one love with each other. We see this desire from Jesus when he prays in John 17:20-21 *I'm not praying only for them but also for those who believe in me because of their word. I pray that they will be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. I pray that they will be in us, so that the world will believe that you sent me (NRSV).*

On the 2nd Sunday of May, we celebrate the love of God in Christian homes worldwide. On this special day, we celebrate mothers who have attempted to expose the love of Christ to people of all different ages, races, and nations. The most perfect love which any of us can achieve is a Christ centered love which exposes the work and the love of God in this world. Jesus reminds us of this Godly love when he says, *I've made your name known to them and will continue to make it known to them so that your love for me will be in them, and I myself will be in them (John 17:26).*

Unfortunately, we often find ourselves at odds with each other in this world where Jesus prayed for oneness. We live in a day and age where compassion, mercy, and compromise are often perceived as signs of weakness. Party politicians fight for ultimate power and not compassionate ideas which expose meaningful communal responsibility for the people. Many U.S. Citizens have become more aggressive, defensive, and unapologetic with their dialogue and conversation. Road rage is at an all-time high as people fight to gain and defend their territory on the highways, bi-ways, and the open road. Attitudes of forgiveness and Christian love are often neglected as thoughts of vigilante and retribution have now become prioritized, accepted, and expected.

As children, we often looked to our moms when we felt hurt and defeated. As grown-ups, we still remember the nurture and compassion which our mothers had for us whenever we skinned our knee, felt bullied, or fell away from our circle of friends. This same comfort, healing, and transformation came from Jesus Christ, who knew our sorrows, feels our pain, and comforts and heals us in our time of trial. Therefore, on May 8th, 2016, we celebrate moms, not for their human efforts, accomplishments, or achievements. We celebrate the love of God in this world through mothers who have offered their Christ-centered, transforming love when we needed it the most. Just as Christ called his followers to live out his life and ministry, we are called to emulate the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, through this *one love*. That is, we witness the love of Christ, which comes through a mother's love, which we are called to emulate in this world. Maybe emulating and exposing this Christ-centered love is possible and evident. We have seen his love through the love of our own mothers.

richment and Review Notebook" (no charge!) to guide us through a process of opening our ears, minds and hearts to God's Voice from within.



The Stephen Minister receives 50 hours of structured training to learn the supportive Christian caring skills needed, including listening and confidentiality for the



Care-Receiver to trust in the Lord to walk the path toward healing and growth. In April our church commissioned seven new Stephen Ministers and one new Stephen Leader to join our Pastoral Care ministries.

Youth News

On Friday, April 22nd, First Gilbert Youth enjoyed a night of packing food at the local Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) site. Feed My Starving Children is a Christian non-profit organization that coordinates the packaging and distribution of nutrient-rich food to people in developing nations. FMSC was founded in 1987 and to date has reached out to more than 70 countries. Their vision as an organization is to eliminate starvation in children throughout the world by helping to instill compassion in people to hear and respond to the cries of those in need.

It is a humbling experience to learn of the need of children in countries where food is not "expected" like it is here in our own community. To learn from the United Nations that 11 million children—30,000 every day—die from preventable or treatable causes is astounding. If that doesn't cause us grief and great sadness with an urge to *do something*, then what will? How cold must we be as a community to sit idly by and let children go without food while we throw away nearly \$165 billion dollars worth of food annually in this country? Far be it from me to not provide opportunities for students to spend an hour and a half of their time to save lives.

A group of 16 went to Feed My Starving Children's packing site in Mesa to pack food that will eventually reach its destination to provide nutrients to children who desperately need it. In total, our packing session packed a total of 80 boxes which provides 17,280 meals—feeding 47 children for an entire year. Our youth, specifically, packed 12 boxes of food, totaling 2,592 meals—feeding 7 kids for an entire year. While we will not personally be handing the meals to the children, we know that we did something to contribute, albeit a small contribution.

Feed My Starving children opened a new permanent facility in Mesa, doubling the size of its old location in Tempe. The new facility is 25,000 square feet compared to its Tempe location of 10,000 square feet. This is the Minnesota-based company's largest facility. It gladdens my heart to see that the city and people of Phoenix met this company and its vision with such enthusiasm that they now refer to this area as the "crown jewel" of Feed My Starving Children.

It is this enthusiasm that I want students to catch—it's contagious you know. I pray that the students would catch on fire with enthusiasm for God, the Gospel, and a love for others including the least of these, marginalized, and oppressed. Packing some food at Feed My Starving Children is not the end but I hope it is a means by which the students encounter the living God and are radically changed from the inside out.

In my own selfishness, I thought the trip was to help and teach others about the love of God. The value of the experience and lessons they taught us cannot be measured. For whatever time I have here on earth, I will be able to share what God is doing in people's lives in places many cannot imagine. We witnessed His presence every day and I am so thankful you allow me to me a part of that journey.

Most importantly, I want to say thank you to the one-on-one relationships we have had with so many of you. Even though they rarely expanded outside the church campus, I know they are friendship I can always cherish. No matter where God leads us, Gilbert will always be special.

Before leaving sometime in June, I hope to personally thank you to each for your support in this journey. Pray for us as I follow God's call into the ministry and pray for my new church home at Hope UMC in Bullhead City. May God continue to bless First United Methodist Church of Gilbert.
