A Word from Pastor Deborah



He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

These stirring words and an Easter Bell peal open each of our services on Easter Sunday, as we gather in awe and wonder to remind ourselves that Jesus' grim death on the cross and his burial in a cold dark tomb were not the last word. God always has the last word, and our God is a God of life! In Jesus' words, as he answered the trick question about multiple marriages and who is married to whom in heaven, "you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God.....He is God not of the dead, but of the living." (Matthew 22:29b, 32b)

That is good news when we face moments that feel like death: moments when someone we love begins or completes the journey from this life to the next; moments when we lose a job, or a relationship, or a dream, or a sense of purpose, or our hope for something better. If God can raise Jesus from the dead, God can bring life, light, and hope to all of our places of darkness, transition, and hopelessness.

Our Easter declaration reminds us of these essential, undeniable truths of our faith. In the words of the old preacher, "It may be Friday, but Sunday's a-coming."

With the news of pastoral changes at First UMC of Gilbert, it may feel like Friday – like the end, in some ways. It is the end, in some ways: the end of this chapter in mission and ministry at First. But it is also the beginning of the next. There will be a new Senior Pastor, and a new Associate Pastor, and they will arrive with energy and hope and purpose. They will have the privilege of meeting the outstanding leaders who are already in place across every area of the church: leaders who are faithful, grounded, disciplined, hopeful, and ready to do what is needed to continue the good work God has begun in us, with us, and through us.



You will teach them about your hopes and dreams; about the vision and mission you have discerned together; about the programs that are drawing more and more people into classes and into service as congregational care ministers and Stephen Ministers; about the new building and all it will offer to new generations of children, youth, and adults. You will work with them to become more invitational and more welcoming to newcomers. You will offer your love and support, which was given so generously to each of us when we arrived and was so helpful for each of us. And together you and they will seek the will of God for this church in this unfolding moment. Beyond the Friday, beyond our mutual grief and sense of loss, will be Sunday: the birth of new relationships, hopes, dreams and purpose.

We still have several months together, and I cherish every moment when I can tell many of you how much you mean to me, and how good it has been to work together, and how rewarding it has been to see so many people stepping up and out into brave new ministries for Jesus' sake. We will worship together, singing, in John Wesley's instructions in the front of the hymnal, "lustily and with a good courage." We will pray and give thanks and break bread and celebrate all God has done, all God is doing, all God has yet to do in us with us, for us, and through us.

He is risen. He is risen indeed. Let us live as resurrection people, in the light and love of God's goodness, grace, forgiveness, hope, and power, treasuring the time we yet have together, and all that is yet ahead.

A Word from Pastor Gwen



"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." – John 3:16

"This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers." – I John 3:16

One summer at a family reunion in the Black Hills of South Dakota the lodge we were staying in came dangerously close to being caught in a forest fire. The glow of the fire on the horizon and the fine ash falling from the sky awakened us to the reality of how close the fire was. As we evacuated I was forced to think about what I would do if the wind changed and the fire caught us unaware.

I was reminded of the fires that have done much damage all across the western United States over the years. An article in National Geographic had once recounted the story of a ranger who was checking in an area heavily damaged by a fire in Yellowstone National Park. On the ground beneath the charred form of a tree he noticed a sickening sight. Perched like a statue in the ash were the remains of a bird. He gently poked the remains with a stick. As he did three tiny chicks scurried from under their dead mother's wings.


The loving mother, aware of impending disaster, had carried her babies to the base of the tree and had gathered them to safety beneath her wings, knowing by instinct that the toxic smoke would rise. She could have flown to safety, abandoning her babies to the flames, but she chose to remain there steadfast as the blaze and the heat scorched her small body. Because she had been willing to die, those under the cover of her wings would live.


Isn't this a lot like what God has done for us in Jesus Christ? Much like the mother bird, Jesus gave his life so that we might live. So great was his love for us, he willingly chose to die when he could have saved himself and abandoned us to face the flames of eternal destruction. He held steadfast as they nailed him to a cross so that under his outstretched arms we could have eternal life.

I am so grateful for the cross. I am so grateful that Jesus sacrificed so that we might be saved. Aren't you?




