Something from nothing. It sounds like God creating doesn't it. It sounds like the voice of Almighty God commanding one more time, "Let there be ."





### A Word from Pastor Diamond

### Greetings First UMC of Gilbert Family!

I say family because isn't that who we are to each other? We are all siblings in Christ, created, blessed and redeemed by a love greater than we can ever imagine. So as a newcomer to the FUMC Gilbert Family I figured you might want to know more about me.

### God is telling you something, is calling you to something...

I was born and raised in Las Vegas, Nevada. When I was 9 my family started going to a United Methodist Church because one of my mother's friends had the courage to invite her. They say it takes a village to raise a child and I can confidently say the UMC helped raise me. I became very active in the church as a youth so it was no surprise when I took the plunge and accepted a call to ministry when I was a junior in high school. I say it was no surprise, but actually it was a HUGE surprise to me, just not the people around. I was surrounded by people who loved me and knew me and knew I would be a great fit for pastoral ministry, I just needed to believe them. Finally when I felt the Spirit move at a church conference discussing pastoral leadership, I knew that's where I was headed.

Once I said yes, a weight lifted off my shoulders and I told God that I would go wherever I was called. After that, my life has been filled with moments sometimes small, sometimes huge, where it became clear to me God was either leading me somewhere or affirming exactly where I was. Unfortunately, sometimes God's timeline isn't the same as mine and I have had to learn to accept last minute plans. For college, God sent me to Pfeiffer University in North Carolina, I applied in May, got accepted in June, and moved in August. At the end of my senior year of college I still wasn't set on what seminary to go to, but I saw a presentation on the United Methodist Church's missionary program a few weeks before the application was due. So that is when God sent me to be a missionary in New Jersey and the Appalachian Mountains

of North Carolina. Then I went to Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, the only seminary application I ended up completing, but ended up being the perfect fit.

My last semester of seminary was hard because my classmates all knew where they were going next, but I didn't. For months they were talking about their new appointments and looking for houses. Some of them were worried about me because I didn't know and if I'm honest some days I was nervous too. But again, God works on a different timeline. The morning after my graduation, I got a call and God (and a quick Google search) showed me the wonders of Gilbert, AZ.

The moment I got here I have been surrounded by a wonderful community and extravagant hospitality. Gilbert quickly become home and my spirit feels at peace. This is a sign from God that I am in the right place.

### ...listen because God will take you to some extraordinary places.

The Bible is full of theophanies, or moments when God or a messenger of God visibly manifested before humankind, but I think God doesn't always need to work in that way. When we look for "signs and wonders" we shouldn't just look for mighty burning bushes or choirs of angels, but those smaller signs of God's movement like an affirming word from a stranger, a calmness in your spirit, or a time when everything just clicks in place. In 1 Kings when the prophet Elijah met

God, it wasn't in the mighty storm, earthquake, or fire, but in the silence. Keep an eye out for those small signs because God is telling you something, is calling you to something, listen because God will take you to some extraordinary spaces.



### Elementary & Preteen

GOD VIEW:

GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN WISDOM AND GOD'S CHARACTER, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD'S BIG STORY

WISDOM IS A REFLECTION OF THE CHARACTER OF GOD.

### WEEK 1

We start the month with Jesus and our only glimpse into His life as a child. In Luke 2:41-52 we discover that Jesus knew His Father's house was where he needed to be. We're told that Jesus grew in wisdom, faith, and friendship. This is the model we should follow as we seek to grow in our own relationship with God.

Bottom Line: If you want to be wise, search for wisdom. Kids are growing up in the information age. There is access to more data than we could possibly need or imagine. But our knowledge is only as good as how we apply it. We pray that kids find value in searching for wisdom through God's Word, trusted friends, Small Group Leaders, and their family. Wisdom is out there; we just need to find it.

### WEEK 2

This week, we look to something Solomon wrote in Proverbs 22:3. Wise people see danger and go to a safe place, but childish people keep going and suffer for it, (NIrV). Without thinking, people can rush into a situation and soon discover that they are in trouble. Solomon warns us to make sure we know what we're facing before we move forward with a decision.

Bottom Line: If you want to be wise, look before you leap. Kids face all sorts of decisions where they have to decide if they will keep going or pause to evaluate the best option. This happens as they learn to navigate friendships, technology, and priorities. We hope that kids discover that pausing to ask, "What's the wise choice in this situation?" can save them from getting hurt.

### WEEK 3

In week three, we head to 2 Chronicles 10 and discover what happens with Solomon's son, Rehoboam. When he took over as king over Israel, people pleaded with him to make life easier for them. Rehoboam received counsel on both sides of this issue. Rather than acting on the advice from his father's advisers, he acts on the foolish advice of his friends. This ends up causing a split in the nation of Israel, creating Israel and Judah.

Bottom Line: If you want to be wise, hang out with wise people. It's been said that we are sum total of our five closest friends. Who we choose to spend our time with influences not only the choices we make but who we are. We pray that kids learn that when they surround themselves with wise friends, they will be more likely to make wise choices throughout every area of their life.


### WEEK 4

In week four, we finish up the month with another one of Solomon's proverbs in Proverbs 3:5-6. This familiar passage talks about trusting God's plan rather than our own. When we lean on our own understanding, we will never consistently make the wise choice. It's through trusting in God that we can find true wisdom for our life.

Bottom Line: If you want to be wise, trust God to give you wisdom. God is the author of wisdom. We can grow in wisdom as we read God's word and discover His plan for our life. We pray that kids will put their trust in Jesus and discover how they can grow in their relationship with Him. They don't have to fear anything that happens. God can give us the con-

fidence to trust Him no matter what.



- Provided staff and volunteers to plan and take our youth on two mission trips. 8 Junior High youth, with one volunteer chaperone and our Youth Director, Ray Vallera, went to San Diego July 1 through July 7. 12 Senior High youth, with four volunteer chaperones, went to Tsaile, AZ on the Navajo reservation July 8 through July 14.
