Guidelines

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, First Gilbert has created a reopening plan that was designed to provide a safe transition between closure and full services. This plan outlines mandatory steps that everyone must follow as the church reopens.

Requirements for In-Person Worship

- Total in-person attendance is limited
- · Reserve seats through church website: gilbertumc.org
- If you have not done so already, complete the Covenant viewable here: gilbert-covenant/
- · Check in at the table on the patio when you arrive
- Masks must be worn at all times for those 6 or older
- Observe 6' social distancing between family groups
- · Don't shake hands, hug or touch others
- · Follow all instructions from the ushers and staff
- Please use the hand sanitizer provided
- Do not attend if you have tested positive for COVID, or were exposed to someone who has tested positive
- Do not attend if you are feeling sick
- No food or drink; beverages and snacks not served
- Sunday School and the Nursery will not be available
- Please keep children with you at all times

If an individual cannot wear a mask then we are required to suspend the service and the congregation will be dismissed. Your patience and cooperation is appreciated!

They have been liturgists and sung with the choir, and planned their wedding.














The Book Club Corner






Our garden is growing! We picked lettuce and radishes to try at snack time with ranch dressing. Soon our tomatoes and carrots will be ready, the kids are very excited!

Enjoy your Spring Break this year! There will be no school from Monday, March 8th- Friday, March 12th. The first day back will be Monday, March 15th.


