## A Special Announcement from Desert Southwest Conference East District Superintendent Rev. N. Susan Brims March 24, 2022



Dear Members and Friends of First United Methodist Church of Gilbert:

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ. I pray you are experiencing a very Holy Lent. This is a time in the Christian year that shapes our faith in powerful ways, calling us to remember who we are as the people of God, and reminding us how we are to live.

In faith I want to share with you the news that after prayerful discussion Bishop Grant J. Hagiya has discerned that there will be a change in an appointment at your church. Bishop Hagiya intends to appoint the Rev. Diamond Pate as pastor of Federated Community Church in Flagstaff, effective July 1, 2022. Rev. Pate will continue to serve as your associate pastor until June 30, 2022. As I share this word with you, I also want to thank you for the opportunities Rev. Pate has had in the first appointment in her career as a pastor.

Rev. Pate has been your associate pastor for the past 4 years. During that time, we know you have come to appreciate the many gifts she brought to your church. In the time between now and when Rev. Pate begins her new appointment we know you will want to find appropriate ways to express your gratitude to Diamond for all that she means to you and the ministry of your church.

As your district superintendent, I have been in conversation with your Staff Parish Relations Committee about the gifts and graces needed in the next associate pastor. To address some of the financial concerns of First UMC-Gilbert, I understand that we will be looking for an associate pastor who is able to serve less than full time. Please know that Bishop Grant and the appointive cabinet have been in prayerful discussion and hope to be able to soon share with you the news about a new appointment. Until that time we ask you to be in prayer with us.

In closing, let me share with you the words from one of my favorite hymns. "In the Midst of New Dimensions," Words and Music by Julian Rush (1985):

In the midst of new dimensions, in the face of changing ways. Who will lead the pilgrim peoples wandering in their separate ways?
