

June Missions Update By Joyce Steiner

In April, I participated in a memorial service for my brother-in-law. I gave the opening prayer. It began with me imploring God to "be unto us like a mother hen is to her chicks." Yes, I asked God to gather us beneath God's mothering wings so as to provide us solace in our time of grief.



God mothers us in many other ways: by giving us shelter from the storms in our lives; feeding us spiritually; helping us to stand when we have fallen spiritually; giving us encouragement, providing cause to laugh when our hearts are heavy. Sometimes the mothering comes from reading the Bible, hearing a sermon, singing a hymn or taking communion. Sometimes, the mothering comes through other people. Today I am praying for Baby Haddon and family.

Missions work is about God using us as instruments of love through which people in need receive divine mothering. God gave us compassionate hearts so that we will be bothered by the suffering of others and thus want to help relieve their suffering. We are bothered by the plight of homeless women, so this year we donated 108 purses containing personal care items. This we did so that homeless mothers could receive a Mother's Day Gift. We are bothered by people dying from heat-related causes so we are beginning to collect bottled water to be donated to a hydration station in the Phoenix area. God tugs at our heartstrings by making us aware that many children at Gilbert Elementary School are in need of school supplies. We let the children experience God's mothering love by giving them school supplies. We know many of those same children often get hungry in the afternoons. This also tugs at our heartstrings because we know hungry children find it hard to concentrate. Hence, we channel God's mothering love by providing them with healthy snacks. (Information about these projects is available at the Missions Table in the Courtyard.)

I am told that the children are very appreciative of our gifts, but also puzzled by our willingness to help address their needs. They asked one our committee member, Elice, who delivers the snacks, why we would want to help them. The answer is easy. They are God's children. By loving them through addressing their unmet needs, we help them become all that God intends for them to be.

Thanks all of you for your compassionate hearts and your willingness to follow the prompting of your hearts to be like a mother hen to those in needs.

What is the Congregation Care Program?

Pastors and church leaders genuinely want to care for people in their congregations and communities. But pastors cannot care for an entire church, and most laypersons don't have the training to do it. The Caring Congregation Ministry is a model for person-to-person care that's been proven to work in small and large churches across the U.S. It is a laity-centered ministry, where laypersons receive rigorous training and then are commissioned to serve as Congregational Care Ministers, caring for others in their own congregation and their extended community.

This remarkable approach to congregational care was first developed by Karen Lampe and her team at The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection, in Kansas City. It has been tested, refined, and strengthened, and is now being adapted in all sorts of congregational settings.

Here at First Gilbert, we have an active and trained group that provides home-bound communion, hospital visits, phone calls, and home visits. The team is led by Anita Broughton. The team includes Pastor Adriana, Tom Bristow, Janelle Chiricuzio, George Dailey, Gayle Disch, Valerie Kellogg, Susan Libbert, Joyce Steiner, and Kathy Tremain.

If you are in need of support please reach out to the church office or anyone on the team. The team is trained, have compassionate hearts, and are prepared to offer you support during a challenging time.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

- Go on a Nature walk in the morning and find each of the colors of the rainbow
- Paint with water on the back porch

- Make a cave or fort by covering the kitchen table with several sheets, have a
 picnic in there!
- Make Moon Sand

BASIC SUPPLIES:

- Flour (or rice flour for a gluten-free option)
- Oil (most tutorials online suggest baby oil, but if you're worried about your kids putting this in their mouths, coconut and vegetable oils work exactly the same way and are taste-safe)

OPTIONAL SUPPLIES:

Food coloring or kool-aid packets (2-3 packets for every 2 cups of flour for bright, vibrant colors)
 ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES FOR PLAY:

- Buckets, pails
- Sand and water toys
- Toy cars and trucks

DIY Moon Sand Instructions:

1. Mix the ingredients in a large bowl

You want an 8:1 ratio of flour to oil. So 4 cups flour and 1/2 cup oil, 8 cups flour and 1 cup oil, etc. Mix them together (with color if desired) until the flour still feels silky and sandy, but will hold a shape if you squeeze it in your hands.

2. Move to a large bin or tray

Pour your moon sand into a large bin or tray for indoor or outdoor play

Add toys and play!

You can use this as a fun sensory experience all on its own, or add tools or toys to a bin or tray for play. When playtime has ended, store your moon sand in an airtight container to play with later




Tuesday Morning Bible Study
