About Pastor Kristin



Mission Update July 2024! By Joyce Steiner, Mission Chair

Summer has officially arrived accompanied by seriously high temperatures. As a result, vulnerable people (elderly and homeless individuals) are at significant risk for heat related illness or even death. We as a church are helping to address this problem by holding a water drive and then donating the water to one of the heat relief stations in the network created by the Arizona Interfaith Network.



There are other simple ways to assist in heat relief.

- Search for "Sustainable and Accessible Ways to Keep Cool" to reach the flyer by that name. It provides useful tips on how to keep cool in the event of a power outage or the need to use air conditioning sparingly.
- Become a cool caller. The program, once it is launched, has volunteers check on vulnerable community members via telephone during the heat season. If you would like more information, notify Katie.Sexton@azfiathnetwork.org.
- Distribute copies of the" Heat Relief Flier." It lists cooling centers, informs readers that pets are welcome, and explains how to access free transportation. Highlight that information (at the bottom of the page) so it is does not get overlooked. To reach the flier, search for "Support AFN's Heat Relief Program." Scroll past the heading "Take your Outreach on the Road." Continue to the fourth line of the paragraph beneath the heading. Finally, click on "Heat Relief flier.

Adult Ministry Studies


Choir Sunday School



A Always read a bedtime story... and a mid-morning story, when the kids aren't too tired! If they want to read the same story over and over, then follow their lead and go for it! If they want to "read" the book and it's not completely accurate, it's ok! Let them pretend to read!


"As your young child listens to stories, he learns that all good stories have a beginning, middle, and end. He also learns to predict, based on the book cover, what the story will be about, as well as what might happen next or how the story will end. Young children learn that there are characters in stories and a particular setting (where and when it takes place). 


Tuesday Morning Bible Study

24/7 HELPLINE

Call **800.272.3900**, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to speak confidentially with a Care Consultant. These professionals provide support, information about Alzheimer's and related dementias, guidance on care options, help with planning for the future, coaching for family members, strategies to address safety concerns, and referrals to local resources. Support is free of charge and offered in over 200 languages.

SUPPORT GROUPS

Support Groups provide a forum to share feelings, concerns, information, and learn new skills. The Desert Southwest Chapter offers over 50 support groups, in English and Spanish, across Arizona and southern Nevada. All of our support groups are facilitated by trained individuals and meet at various locations and times. Most groups are for family and friends supporting a loved one with dementia, but there are also groups designed specifically for individuals with early stage dementia.
